# Philippines

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 1: Arrival and Welcome

Welcome to the Philippines. Arrive in Cebu and participate in a welcome dinner and briefing session from International Care Ministries (ICM) about their *Transform Program* and working with the ultra-poor.

## Day 2: Community Visit 1

Travel to an ICM community and participate in building a tippy-tap, an improvised faucet using empty plastic bottles, which is useful for homes without running water. ICM communities are taught to encourage proper hand washing to prevent the spread of bacteria and improve the health status of the community.

Make container gardens using empty soda bottles hung on a bamboo frame. Container Gardens are taught to ICM communities to encourage proper nutrition and lessen household food expenses.

*Community Service Project:* Build an outdoor toilet, locally known as a CR (Comfort Room). Many families living in extreme poverty do not even possess this basic necessity. Your work will significantly improve the hygiene practices of the community. Take time to get to know the family who will benefit from this project.

## Day 3: Community Visit 2

Travel to a *Transform Community* and meet the pastor and program participants. Meet with the *Savings Group* leader to learn about the ICM's *Prevail Program* and its positive impact on the community. Work with members of the *Savings Group* to support their small businesses. Activities will vary based on the specific nature of each group's enterprise. It's a great opportunity to lend a hand, learn something new, and make a difference in the lives of the local people. Take a walk through the community and visit some members' homes. In the afternoon, assemble the frame and plywood sides for the Comfort Room project.



# Philippines

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 4 and 5: Community Visit 3

Visit a new community and learn about ICM's *Family Academy Program*. The Family Academy is ICM's holistic early childhood education and development program that aims to prepare children from ultra-poor families to enter school with a strong academic foundation.

Engage in an arts and crafts session with a mother and her child. Learn how the Family Academy supports children's learning and strengthens the bond between mother and child. If time permits, enjoy additional playtime with the Family Academy kids.

Take a walk around the community and visit some of the children's homes. This is your chance to meet their family members, see their living conditions and witness *Family Academy* in action.

Continue work on the Comfort Room Project. Attach the toilet bowl to the floor, secure the vent pipe, and paint the walls. Your efforts will leave a lasting impact and your kindness will be remembered long after the project is completed.

## Day 6: Kids Camp

Proceed to the Kids Camp venue. Have an enriching and fun-filled day with the local kids at the camp. The activities scheduled each day include sports, crafts, and skits, however, DSC students will plan their own unique activities in advance to create the most meaningful experiences.

## Merapoh, Malaysia

Reforestation and conservation in Malaysia's ancient tropical rainforest. Experience cultural exchange with the Batek tribe, learning traditional jungle survival skills like bamboo cooking and shelter building. Explore Taman Negara National Park, including a rock-climbing adventure in the spectacular limestone formations.





# Malaysia

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 1: Welcome to Malaysia

Arrive at Kuala Lumpur International airport and travel to Gua Musang, which will serve as the base of operations for the next three days.

## Day 2: Gua Musang – Reforestation

Board the bus to Merapoh to begin the day in the nursery. Fill bags with soil and plant seedlings that will later be transported to tree-planting sites. In the afternoon, head into the jungle to plant trees. Carrying healthy saplings from the nursery, restore deforested areas with much-needed vegetation.

## Day 3: Taman Negara National Park

Journey into the heart of Taman Negara National Park, hiking along the canopy walkway and taking in breathtaking views of the rainforest from above. Students will be accompanied by guides from the Batek tribe, a semi-nomadic group that has called Taman Negara home for hundreds of years. After lunch, the guides will share traditional skills, teaching us how to shoot blow darts, cook using bamboo, and build shelters in the jungle.

## Day 4: Adventure

Embark on a caving expedition, equipped with helmets and headlamps, to explore wild limestone caves. Students will challenge themselves as they navigate multi-level, multi-chambered formations, discovering the hidden beauty within. Experience rock climbing on Malaysia's famous limestone cliffs, which attract climbers from around the world.



# Malaysia

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 5: Kuala Lumpur - Reforestation

Travel back to Kuala Lumpur and experience the spectacular skyline with breathtaking views of the city, including the iconic Petronas Towers. Participate in a reforestation project in the city before a reflection on the week's activities.

## Day 6: Mangrove tree planting & Mah Meri Cultural Village

Spend the final day with some reforestation service work in a mangrove forest, which are critical ecosystems in the surrounding areas. Also visit Mah Meri Cultural Village to explore the rich history and traditions of Malaysian culture.

## Day 7: Departure for Hong Kong

Spend a few more hours exploring the central market before flying back to Hong Kong.

# Cambodia

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 1: Arrival in Siem Reap

Welcome to Cambodia! Visit the stunning Ta Prohm Temple, made famous in the Tomb Raider movies. Ta Prohm is overrun with massive trees, their roots intertwined with the temple stones almost as if they are frozen in battle. Here we also have an introduction to the week ahead, meet the Indago team, and learn a few Khmer words and phrases.

## Day 2-4: Service

While Siem Reap may seem to be flourishing to a tourist on a short stay, the province is in fact one of the three poorest in Cambodia. We will work in the village of Kompheim, which lies just outside of Siem Reap town and is an area of extreme poverty. A recurrent theme of individual projects will be:

- Leaving a tangible change. Many of our Cambodian projects are based around building important structures (such as school classrooms and training workshops) from plastic bottles and dry plastic waste from around the village.
- Teaching in the school. Our partners, HUSK, run several English language classes every week throughout the year in order to supplement the local students' education, providing them with greater employment opportunities in later life. We will go into the school to teach English to the local students.



# Cambodia

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 5: Cycling & Circus Skills

We start off the day with a cycling adventure. The bike ride brings us to a hidden temple in the forest where we stop for lunch and games. Participate in a circus skills workshop with local Cambodian artists. This is linked to an NGO working to awaken the arts in Cambodia. After a traditional Khmer dinner we then get to see the circus in action.

In the evening, visit Siem Reap's famous night market, where we can haggle for the perfect souvenir, or simply relax with a Khmer style foot massage.

## Day 6: Temples and Great Race

Visit the staggering Angkor Wat. The jewel of the Khmer Empire was built over 900 years ago and remains the largest religious monument ever built. A guided tour through the incredible complex will bring Angkor to life. Students will learn about the incredible temple construction, the people who lived around it, and the stories of the gods and demons that adorn its walls. Explore the amazing city of Angkor Thom, surrounded by walls and five separate gates. Within the city is the amazing Bayon temple adorned with smiling faces, the Terrace of the Leper King, and Elephant Terrace.

After lunch, take a completely different approach to learning about Angkor culture with the Angkor Great Race. This team challenge is conducted in Siem Reap and the surrounding villages. Teams undertake tasks, both physical and mental, while navigating their way around and learning about the incredible history and culture of the region on their way. Finish the trip in style with a group barbecue providing an opportunity to reflect together on an amazing week.

## Day 7: Giving Alms & Departure

We have an early start this morning, but nobody will want to miss the journey to a local rural village to give alms as saffron monks wander through the village. This daybreak Buddhist ritual dates back thousands of years and is incredibly important in Khmer culture. An alms gift of food and water is part of ancient belief system of earning merit and honouring the deceased. We take part in the ceremony with appropriately prepared gifts. Travel back to Hong Kong with unforgettable memories.

# Sri Lanka

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 1: Welcome to Sri Lanka

Meet the World Volunteer team who will introduce the plan for the week. Learn about the Sri Lanka's history, culture, and customs to help feel at home on this incredible country.

## Day 2: Southern Coast

Travel to the southern coast to team up with community partners working with Sri Lanka's youth on issues of sustainability. Today's project will focus on marine and coastal conservation on the beautiful beaches of the southern coast.

## Day 3: Rainforest Rehabilitation

Spend the day with a local naturalist and community leader at a local tree nursery. Assist with planting and transferring seedlings to gain a better understanding of how much effort goes into reforestation. Visit a rainforest area that is being rehabilitated where most of the forest was cleared for farming activities.

## Day 4: Community Conservation and Coastal Ecosystems

Learn basic kayak and water safety before participating in a lagoon cleanup alongside local community members. The cleanup will focus on the mangrove area where trash gets trapped. This is a great opportunity to spot some of the wildlife such as water monitors, hermit crabs, squirrels and lots of birdlife. In the afternoon, take part in efforts to reestablish wild seagrass beds to support the planned reintroduction of wild manatees to the area.



# Sri Lanka

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 5: From Waves to Wildlife

Today we try to catch a wave. In the morning, travel to the coastal town of Weligama for a surfing lesson. Weligama is one of the best and safest bays in the world to try to catch your first wave. In the afternoon, travel to Udawalawe – an area renowned for its wildlife and conservation efforts. Enjoy some stunning scenery along the way. In the evening, participate in a session focused on wildlife–human conflict, exploring the challenges of protecting animals in regions shared with local communities. This hands–on learning encourages students to consider the balance between development, conservation, and human needs.

## Day 6: Elephant Conservation

Begin the day with an early–morning elephant safari in Udawalawe National Park, observing elephants and other wildlife in their natural habitat. In the afternoon, participate in wildlife conservation activity with dedicated volunteers.

## Day 6: Tea and Heritage

Travel back to the coast, visiting Handunugoda Tea Estate on the way to gain insight into Sri Lanka’s tea industry and its connection to rural communities. Participate in a tea pluck and to understand the complex journey tea takes as it makes its way from the plant to our daily cup. In the evening, visit the historic coastal fort city of Galle. Explore Galle Fort, visit the iconic flag tower and lighthouse while wandering through the old streets of this living piece of history.

## Day 7: Depart for Hong Kong

Spend the morning exploring Colombo visiting Gangaramaya Temple, browsing local markets, or relaxing along the coastal stretch of Galle Face Green. Capture a final group photo and say our goodbyes after a meaningful week of learning, discovery, and connection.

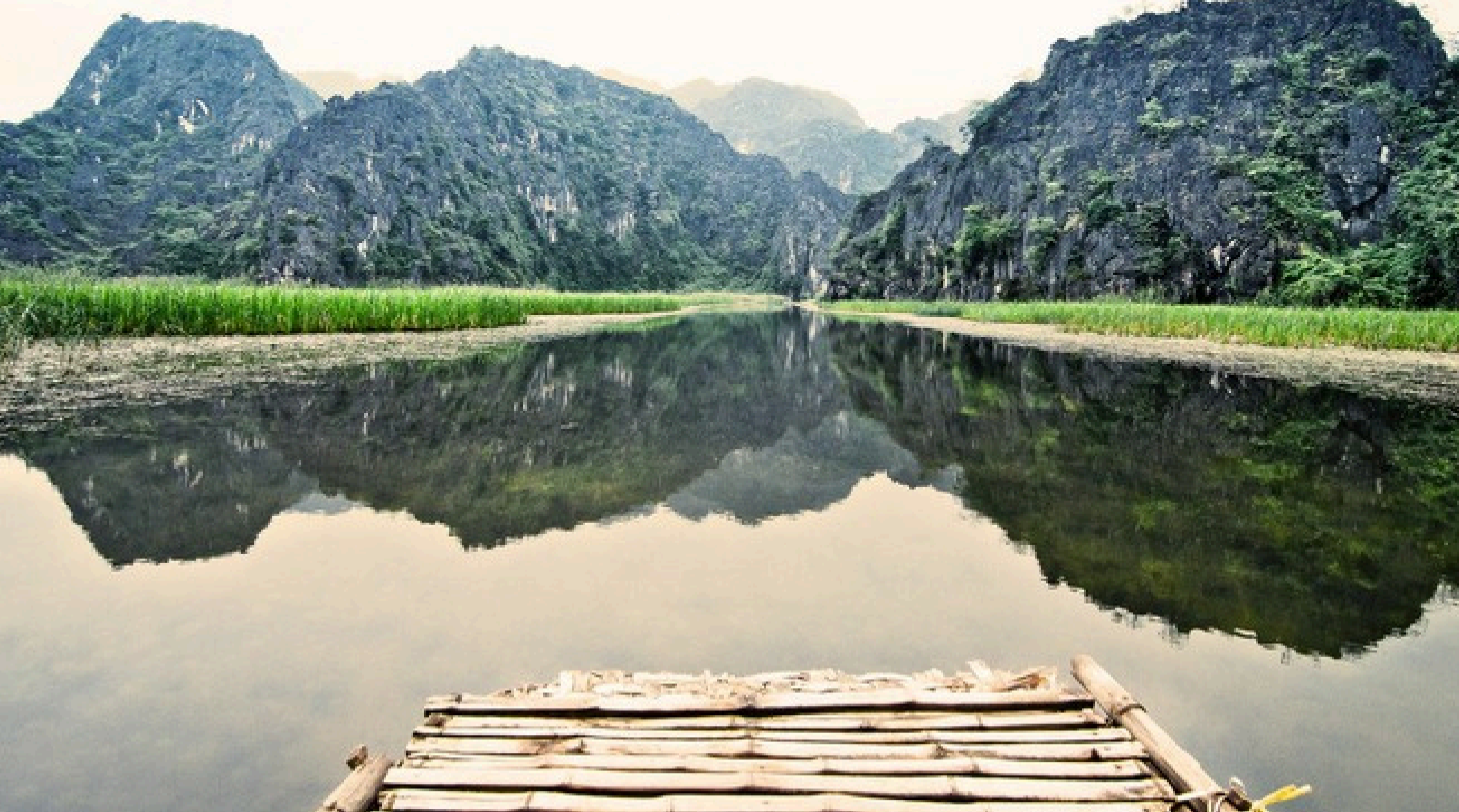

## Northern Vietnam

Support the fight against illegal wildlife trade by partnering with a local Vietnamese conservation organization. Gain firsthand exposure to wildlife rescue and rehabilitation, habitat protection, community engagement, and conservation research.





# Vietnam

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 1 - Welcome to Hanoi

Arrive in Hanoi, Vietnam's vibrant capital, before travelling south to Ninh Bình for teambuilding with World Volunteer leaders.

## Day 2 - Bear Sanctuary Ninh Bình

Support wildlife conservation efforts through service learning at the Bear Sanctuary, which is a project developed by FOUR PAWS, an international animal welfare organization. The sanctuary allows greater governmental enforcement of the existing laws prohibiting the abuse of bears for bile extraction. The sanctuary now cares for over 40 Asiatic black bears. With 24-hour access to both the indoor and outdoor enclosures, the bears can choose to swim in the wading pools, climb on the high platforms specifically constructed for their needs, soak up the sun, play with other bears, forage for food or hide away in their dens when they want to relax.

## Day 3 - Medicinal Plants

Team up with a local social enterprise working to harness the power of nature. Locally grown herbs and other plants can be used for a variety of medicinal purposes. Students will support the efforts to provide natural remedies to those who need it the most.



# Vietnam

Grades 9-12

7 days, 6 nights

## Day 4 & 5 – Cúc Phương National Park

Travel to Cúc Phương National Park, which will be the base for service work over the next two days. Team up with Save Vietnam's Wildlife (SVW) and visit the Pangolin and Carnivore Education Centre to learn about the day's wildlife project, working with pangolins, binturongs, leopard cats, and civets. Visit the botanical gardens nursery, working to preserve rare plants from Cuc Phuong, Vietnam. The garden also acts as a semi-wild, protected enclosure for wildlife release programs.

Visit the Endangered Primate Rescue Center (EPRC) at Cuc Phuong National Park, which is a non-profit, internationally collaborative conservation center founded in 1993 to rescue, rehabilitate, and breed endangered primates confiscated from illegal trade. It functions as a safe haven, holding around 180-250 primates from 14-15 species, including langurs and gibbons, with the goal of reintroducing them to the wild.

## Day 6 – Service and Culture

In the morning, complete the service learning projects with SVW before travelling back to Hanoi. On the way back, learn the art of making a nón lá, the iconic Vietnamese conical hat. In the evening, take a short walk to Hoan Kiem Lake and enjoy a delicious dinner before joining the famous Vietnamese Water Puppet performance. The show is an entertaining way to reflect on what students have learned during this unforgettable journey.

## Day 7: Depart for Hong Kong

Explore some local markets before travelling back to Hong Kong.

## Day 1: Welcome to Foshan

Travel by high speed train from Hong Kong to Foshan. Meet the Peninsula staff and hotel check-in. Visit Nanfeng Ancient Kiln and participate in a clay-making workshop. In the evening, enjoy a welcome dinner and a night exploration in the park.

## Day 2: Ancestral Temple and Lion Dance

Visit the Ancestral Temple and learn about traditional Chinese martial arts. After lunch, students will have an opportunity to participate in a lion dance workshop, learning how to make the lion head and perform the lion dance itself.

## Day 3: Fengjian Watertown and Community Service

Visit the Fengjian Watertown, a historic village in the Shunde District of Foshan. It is renowned as one of the most representative Lingnan-style water villages, with a history dating back to the Western Han Dynasty. Enjoy the relaxing waterways, ancient bridges, and historic architecture. In the afternoon, give back to the community by painting murals or tree cleaning activities for environmental preservation. Visit the vibrant night market in the evening.

## Day 4: Dessert Making and Qinghui Garden

Today, students will learn how to make the famous, sweet milk dessert (shuang pi nai) that originated in Shunde. In the afternoon, visit the Qinghui Garden where students will learn about Lingnan architecture and participate in a hands-on workshop to create a traditional, Manchu window.

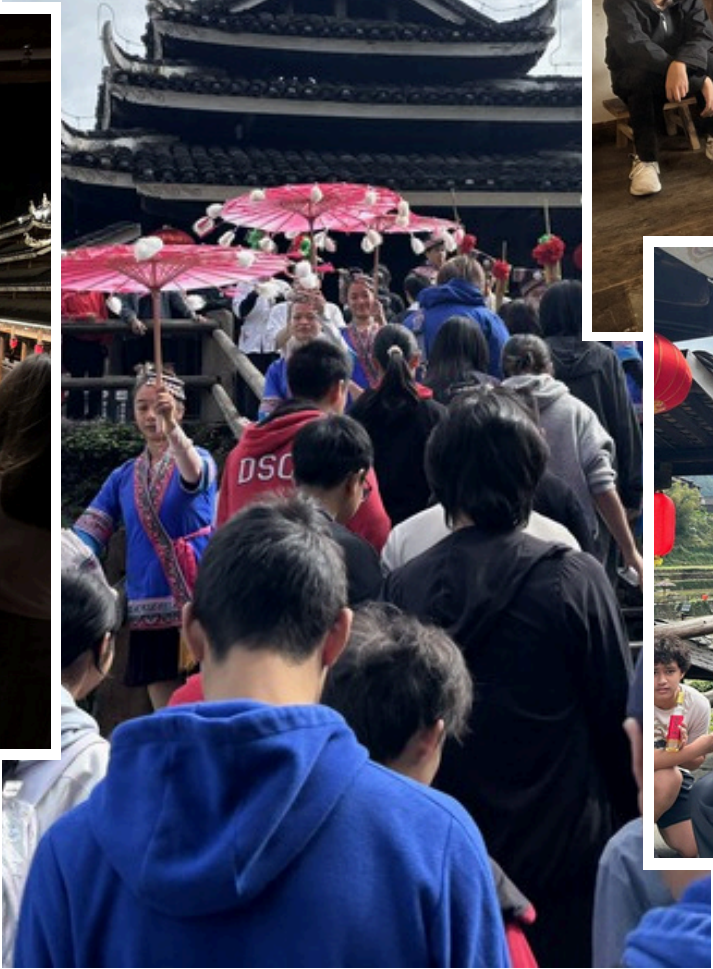
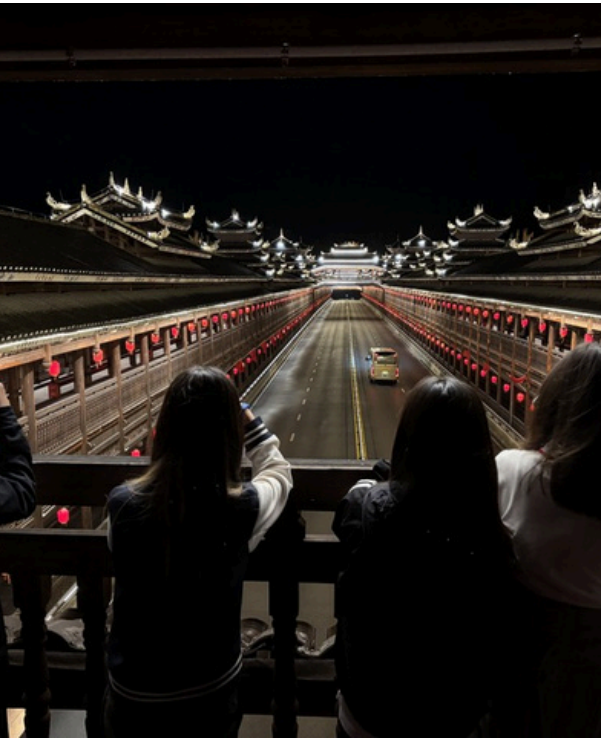

## Day 2: Treasure Hunt and Dong Cultural Activities

After breakfast, participate in a village treasure hunt. After lunch, enjoy an introduction to Dong culture and art through traditional herb-dye cloth making. Later we will experience local sticky rice and ginger tea (Chinese coffee) making experience.

After dinner, we will take part in a traditional Dong architecture discovery workshop.

## Day 3: Architecture and Music

Participate in a guided Dong wooden structured landmark visit to explore architecture and community relationships. After lunch, explore the mini drum tower and wind-rain bridge building.

After dinner, students will have the opportunity to play their own traditional instruments and learn more about the musical artform.

## Day 4: Sanjiang Community Life

After breakfast we will learn about impact of tourism on local life, and learn how to carry out sustainable goals. After lunch, experience the local water source observation and traditional solution know-how. We will end the day with a talent show and sharing session.

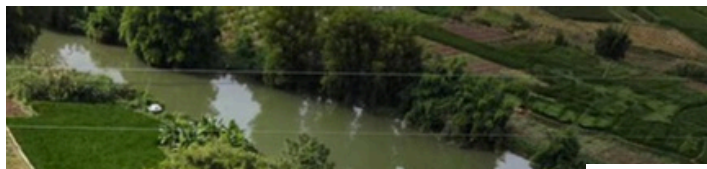

## **About the Program:**

The DSC 40 for 40 Student Ambassadors Programme is a community leadership initiative marking the School's 40th Anniversary. Through a full scholarship sponsored by the CTF Education Group Charitable Foundation (CTFEGCF), selected students will take part in an immersive service-learning experience that nurtures civic responsibility, leadership, and compassion.

## **Important Information:**
